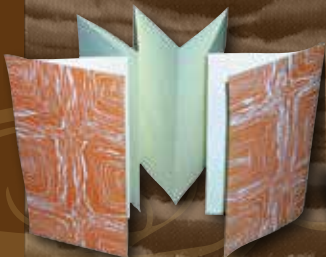

BOOK ARTS TOUR

Discover Paper, Print & the Art of the Book

Experience firsthand the colorful and graphic world of Books and Printing, from Gutenberg to the marvelous Linotype of 1886. The Museum's Book Arts Tour is a journey through the graphic world of printing, paper, books and images using the collections of the Printing Museum. Your two-hour tour begins with the ancient world of the Babylonian clay tablets and Egyptian papyrus scrolls to the Chinese invention of paper and printing. After printing their own page of the Gutenberg Bible, students will help to set metal type and print the pages for a book. They will learn to sew and bind their first book using historical models as inspiration. Dipping their hands into the cold water of a papermaker's vat, students will form their first sheet of paper. With wood type and engraved images of the 19th century, they will assemble and print a broadside, learning about theories of color and design. From lithography to typography, each tour can be customized to meet your curriculum objectives.
